Julian Burnside is a Melbourne-based barrister. He specialises in commercial litigation, trade practices and administrative law. He is also well known for his pro bono work, and is one of Australia's leading advocates in relation to the treatment of asylum seekers.

In 2009, Julian was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia for service as a human rights advocate, particularly for refugees and asylum seekers, to the arts as a patron and fundraiser, and to the law.

Julian is also the recipient of the 2014 Sydney Peace Prize.



FELICITY MILLNER

Felicity is the Director of Litigation at Environmental Justice Australia and was one of the instructing solicitors in *MyEnvironment v VicForests*.

Felicity has worked in environmental and planning law throughout her career and has been involved in a number of significant public interest environmental law cases.

In 2011, Felicity was named Young Australian Environmental Lawyer of the Year by the Law Council of Australia.
